I want your child to have the best possible education in schools which we're proud of. To make this happen we are working hard to make sure all children have the right reading skills and are confident with numbers to make the most of their time at school.

These skills are very important as your child goes through primary and secondary school and beyond, and will be vital in helping them get the job they want in the future. That is why we're introducing new GCSEs in English, Maths and Welsh from September 2015, with more in the following year, to make sure your child has the skills employers tell us they are looking for.

You'd be amazed by how much you can do to help your child get on at school, by just doing little things.

For younger children you can help them with the building blocks for any good education by reading with them and helping them with their numbers by counting, adding and taking away or practising their times tables. The encouragement they get at home will help them build up confidence so they will enjoy school more.

When your child starts to take their crucial exams, your role is just as important. Talking to your child to reassure them and taking an interest in what they are doing will help them get through what can be a stressful time and will encourage them to do their best.
